Genesis of NIEPA

The National Institute of Educational Planning and Administration (NIEPA) has its origin dating back to 1962 when the UNESCO established the Asian Regional Centre for Educational Planners, Administrators and Supervisors which later became the Asian Institute of Educational Planning and Administration (AIEPA) in 1965. The AIEPA was later on converted into the National Staff College for Educational Planners and Administrators as its Asian Programs Division in 1973. Subsequently, with increasing role and functions of the National Staff College, particularly in capacity building, research and professional support services to the state governments, it was transformed into the National Institute of Educational Planning and Administration (NIEPA) in 1979. In recognition of the pioneering work done by the organization in the field of educational planning and administration, the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India has empowered NIEPA to award degrees by way of conferring on it the status of deemed to be University in August, 2006 under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956.

1. About the National Institute

The National Institute is engaged in capacity building and research and development in policy making, planning and administration of education. The Institute is fully financed by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. Apart from other activities relating to capacity development and professional support to public agencies in educational policy, planning and administration, the Institute is also engaged in producing skilled manpower through its M. Phil. and Ph.D. programme in Educational Policy, Planning and Administration.

The National Institute maintains a state of the art library, which caters to the needs of the scholars interested to work in the area of educational policy, planning and administration and related interdisciplinary subjects. The library provides efficient services to facilitate the faculty, researchers, administrators, policy makers and participants of its capacity building programmes in their academic endeavours. NIEPA library has a collection of more than 60,000 books. It regularly subscribes to about 240 Indian and foreign journals and periodicals. The library is fully computerized and it provides referencing services through Internet, ERIC and DELNET based virtual library mode.

The Institute's Documentation Centre has a wide and rich collection of more than 18,500 volumes on educational planning and administration. The Documentation Centre offers a unique collection of official reports, documents and other government publications such as state gazetteers, state census

reports, world handbooks, educational surveys, five-year plans, etc. It also holds a rich collection of dissertations of the Institute's P.G. Diploma Course in Educational Planning and Administration (PGDEPA) and International Diploma Course in Educational Planning and Administration (IDEPA). It also has built up a Digital Archieves with nearly 10,000 documents. The Institute is well equipped in terms of basic infrastructure to promote teaching and research. It has modern

classrooms, seminar halls and state of the art ICT labs with internet connectivity.

Faculty

2. Integrated M.Phil. - Ph.D. Programme 2020-21

The National Institute offers M. Phil - Ph.D. programme in Educational Policy, Planning and Administration from a broader inter-disciplinary social science perspective.

These programmes are designed to build the research capacity of scholars from varied backgrounds

and provide a strong knowledge and skill base in related areas of educational policy, planning, administration and finance. The research studies completed under the M. Phil. and Ph. D. programmes are expected to make significant contributions in enriching the knowledge base, besides providing critical inputs for policy formulation, implementation of reform programmes and capacity building activities. The broad areas of research, covering school and/or higher education are as under:

The National Institute follows all mandatory provisions in the reservation policy of the Government of India for admission to its M.Phil. and Ph. D. Programmes.

3. Eligibility

3.1 Integrated M. Phil. - Ph.D Programme

- (a) Candidates seeking admission to the Integrated M.Phil. Ph.D. Programme shall have minimum of 55% marks (50% for SC/ST candidates, OBC (Non creamy layer) and Persons with Disabilities) or its equivalent grade in Master's Degree in Social Sciences and allied disciplines from a recognized university. Candidates possessing Master's degree in other areas may also be considered if he/she has teaching experience or experience of working in the area of educational policy, planning and administration.
- (b) The NET qualified candidates, who have been awarded Junior Research Fellowships by the UGC, with the above-mentioned educational qualifications are also encouraged to apply.
- (c) Candidates who are yet to clear their final examination at the Master's level are also eligible to apply provided they pass the examination as per the eligibility conditions laid down at (a) above and submit its proof at the time of the entrance examination.
- (d) M.Phil. graduates of NIEPA will be eligible for consideration for admission to the Ph.D. Programme after due scrutiny by the Admission Committee, if they obtain a FGPA of 5 or above on the ten point scale.
- (e) In 2020-21, a maximum of 20 scholars shall be selected for admission to the M.Phil. Ph.D. Programme.

3.2 Ph. D. Programme

a) Direct

- 1. The university also offers admission to direct Ph. D. Programme for candidates with M.Phil. Degree in educational policy, planning and administration.
- 2. In addition to the qualifications mentioned in 3.1 above.
- 3. Candidates with M.Phil. in social sciences/allied areas having publications of high standard are considered for admission in Ph.D. programme.

b) Part-time

Institute also offers Part- time Ph. D. Programme based on the criteria as laid down in the rules of the university. A candidate seeking admission to Part-time Ph.D. programme is required to meet the following criteria:

- i. Should possess the educational qualifications as mentioned in Para 3.2 (1) above;
- ii. Currently, should be in full-time regular employment;
- iii. Should be a senior level educational functionary with a minimum of five years work experience in teaching/research or in educational policy, planning and administration.
- iv. Should be eligible for at least one year leave from his/her organization to do the course work.

4. Selection and Admission

Candidates may apply in the prescribed form for admission to Integrated M.Phil.-Ph.D. Programme or Direct / part time Ph.D. of the Institute along with three copies of the brief write-up on the proposed research topic on a contemporary issue within the broad framework of educational policy, planning and administration.

The duly filled-in application along with the demand draft (required for downloaded forms) and three copies of the brief write-up on any one of the proposed area(s) of research in around 2500 words within the broad areas of educational policy, planning, administration and finance as per the outline

given below should be <u>sent by registered post to the Registrar so as to reach him latest by</u> 8th May, 2020. The envelope should be distinctly marked as "Admission to M. Phil.-Ph.D. Programme 2020-21". The filled-in application can also be submitted in person to the office of the Registrar. Candidates in employment should send their application for admission through proper channel. The forwarding officer (proper channel) should state that the candidate, if selected, will be given one year leave to undergo Course Work at NIEPA, and time as required to attend seminars, and to carry out other work.

The brief write-up should be structured around the proposed topic incorporating therein the importance of the topic, the analytical review of the existing literature on the chosen topic and the research issues proposed to be addressed by the candidate. In each area mentioned, the focus of the proposed write-up should specifically bear upon aspects related to educational policy, planning, administration and finance as the case may be. Suggested outline for the brief write-up is given as under:

- Introduction
- Rationale of the study, i.e. importance and need for the proposed study
- Brief review of related literature
- Research questions
- Objectives
- Proposed methodology
 - -Sample, Tools, Procedure
- Implications of the proposed research
- References

Only the short-listed candidates will be called for written test and interview through which the Institute will assess the research aptitude, general awareness of the candidate about the educational issues, and chosen topic, comprehension of research literature and ability to interpret data and draw inferences.

5. Programme Duration

5.1 Integrated M.Phil.-Ph. D. Programme

The Institute offers Integrated M.Phil.-Ph.D. Programme in Educational Policy, Planning and Administration of five years duration which comprises one year of compulsory course work followed by one year for dissertation work for completion of M.Phil. degree Programme. Of the scholars who successfully completed the M.Phil. prorgramme of the Institute and meet the prescribed criteria (presently FGPA of 5 or above on the ten point scale) are eligible for admission to the Ph. D.Programme. Such scholars are eligible to submit their Doctoral thesis only after two years of registration for the Ph. D. Programme.

5.2 Ph. D. Programme

a) Direct

It is mandatory for all the scholars admitted to the Ph. D. Programme (except those who have obtained M. Phil. degree from NIEPA) to complete the one year course work before confirmation of their Ph. D. registration after which they are eligible to submit their thesis only after 2 years from the date of confirmation for registration to the Ph.D. programme.

b) Part-time

Part-time Ph.D. scholar would be eligible for submission of his/her Ph. D. thesis after a minimum period of three years from the date of registration for the Ph.D. programme. It is mandatory for all the scholars admitted to the part-time Ph. D. programme to complete one year course work before confirmation of their Ph.D. registration.

Notes:

(a) Scholars of M.Phil. - Ph. D. Programme are expected to be present in the Institute for the whole duration of the programme. The programme shall commence from 13th July, 2020.

- (b) Part-time Ph. D. scholars are also expected to be available in the campus very offen for attending seminars and discussions, besides attendance at the course work to fulfil the academic requirements of the programme as prescribed in the rules and regulations of the Institute.
- (c) A scholar, in consultation with his/her supervisor(s), will have to identify, prepare and submit the revised research synopsis latest by the end of the first year of his/her programme of study. This will be a necessary condition for confirming registration of the full-time scholars. If he/ she fails to finalize the proposal and complete the registration process within a reasonable period, his/her admission shall be cancelled.
- (d) Once confirmed as a full-time scholar, he/she shall work on the approved research topic for a period of one year to be eligible to submit his/her M. Phil. Dissertation, and minimum two years after registration in the Ph.D. programme, to be eligible to submit his/her Ph. D. thesis.
- (e) The scholar shall submit through his/her supervisor(s) four copies of the M. Phil. Dissertation along with four copies of the abstract within 2 years from the date of admission in M. Phil. programme.

- (f) The scholar shall submit through his/her supervisor(s) five copies of the Ph. D. thesis not prior to two years (for Full-time scholars) and three years (for Part-time scholars) from the date of registration to the Ph.D. programme. Besides, the scholar shall also submit five copies of the abstract of the thesis in not more than 2500 words. He/she shall also be required to make a presentation and defend his/her research work in a seminar, at least three months prior to submission of the thesis.
- (g) Both M.Phil and Ph.D. programme will be governed by the rules and regulations of the National Institute of Educational Planning and Administration.

6.2 Fellowships

Candidates admitted for the integrated M.Phil.-Ph.D. and Full-time Ph. D. programme will be provided NIEPA fellowship. Candidates who have qualified the National Eligibility Test (NET) with Junior Research Fellowships awarded by the UGC will draw the same through the National Institute as per the norms and procedures laid down by the UGC. However, the continuation of the fellowship shall be subject to the satisfactory progress report of the scholars duly approved by his/her supervisor and appropriate committees at NIEPA.

The scholars of the M. Phil. and Ph.D. programmes would be required to provide part-time assistance to NIEPA faculty in research and training programmes of the National Institute.

7.3 Course Work

Course work which is of one year duration comprises of two semesters. Seven Compulsory courses are of two credits each and two Optional courses (to be opted from a list of sixteen courses) are of one credit each totalling 16 credits and Summer Internship/ProjectWork is of four credits.

The first four Compulsory Courses will be transacted in the first semester, while the rest three Compulsory Courses and two Optional Courses will be transacted in the second semester.

7.4 Dissertation

After the successful completion of course work, the M. Phil. scholars are required to work for the Dissertation and viva voce of 16 credits from the beginning of the second year, which will lead to M.Phil. degree.

7.5 Thesis

The scholars registered for Ph. D. Programme will work on an approved topic and submit the thesis under an identified supervisor. After satisfactory evaluation, successful scholars shall be awarded Ph. D. degree.

8. Evaluation

The course work of the M. Phil. and Ph. D. programme will be assessed through continuous and comprehensive evaluation (CCE) which will be based on multiple sources, criteria and techniques of assessment. It would provide enough feedback and space for improvement. Scheme of evaluation will involve assessment on the basis of seminar presentation, term paper, book review, field attachment, etc. At the end of the course work, there shall be a written examination.

9. Provision in the Event of Discontinuation

- 9.1 In the event of a student discontinuing the programme after the completion of Part I of the M.Phil. Course, he/she may be permitted to leave after due consideration by the authorities of the Institute with a certificate stating the credits earned in Part I of the course. Such a candidate may choose to return to the course later within three years to complete the M.Phil. Programme; in which case he/she may be exempted from undertaking Part I of the course again.
- 9.2 In the event of Direct Ph.D. student discontinuing the programme after completing the Course-work, he/she may be permitted to discontinue after due consideration by the authorities of the Institute. In such an event, the student may be given a certificate stating the credits earned by him/her in the Course-work.
- 9.3 If a student discontinues after successful completion of the Course-work and confirmation of the Ph.D. topic, he/she may be allowed to return to the programme later within three years, after seeking readmission, to complete the Ph.D. programme.

11. General Conditions

- (I) A scholar admitted for M. Phil. and Ph. D programme of the National Institute shall not be allowed to pursue any other course (full-time or part-time) leading to a degree or diploma. Such concurrent activity, if brought to notice, shall call for cancellation of admission to the M. Phil. and Ph. D programmes and disciplinary action.
- (ii) A full-time scholar shall not be permitted to apply for or take up any employment during the duration of the course of the M. Phil. / Ph. D.
- (iii) Candidates who are already in employment shall have to submit 'No Objection Certificate' from their respective employers while applying for any of the M. Phil. and Ph. D. Programmes of the University, along with assurance of leave for necessary period.
- (iv) Scholars shall have to clear all dues before submission of the M.Phil. Dissertation and Ph. D. Thesis except those who have been enrolled in Integrated M.Phil.-Ph. D.Programme, obtained FGPA of 5 or more on the ten point scale after completion of M.Phil Programme and opted for pursuing Ph.D. programme. These candidates need to clear all dues before submission of Ph.D. thesis and not after submission of M.Phil. Dissertation.
- (v) Scholars of the M. Phil. and Ph. D programmes of the National Institute shall have to observe the condition of residence in Delhi/NCR during the respective programmes. However, in connection with the research work/field work, they may be allowed to go out of station with the prior permission of the supervisor(s).
- (vi) All scholars shall be subject to the rules and regulations of NIEPA regarding attendance, leave and other aspects. 75% attendance is mandatory to appear in the Term-end Examination for all Scholars.
- (vii) All scholars are expected not to get involved in any manner in ragging activities. Any scholar found indulging in such activities would be punished as per the U.G.C. guidelines as given below
 - * Cancellation of admission.
 - * Suspension from attending classes.
 - * Withholding/withdrawing Scholarship/Fellowship and other benefits.
 - * Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
 - * Withholding results.
 - * Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament or youth festival etc.

Collective punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on potential ragger.




